Our First Year is in the Books! ~ Bev Pomering


I can't believe that our first year is complete!


Live R.E.A.L. Foundation can come into your place of business and train your employees on how to stop an opioid overdose.

"In a 2019 report by Barclays Research that examined data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the National Institute on Drug Abuse, the bank's analysts said that opioid use in the U.S. has made workers in the industry less productive and has increased costs to the industry. While the precise number of overdose deaths in the North American construction industry is hard to determine, the workers are roughly six times more likely than workers in other manufacturing, industrial and service industries to become addicted to opioids, according to the report."

TIPS FOR EMPLOYERS TO CREATE A SAFER WORKPLACE

- Ensure there's chronic pain/surgery support for employees to reduce opioid use/ abuse risk.
- Incorporate substance use disorder into campaigns to reduce mental health stigma.
- Encourage leaders to share their experiences with substance use disorder.
- Educate managers on the signs of emerging substance use disorder and equip them to make referrals for care.
- Examine your health plan benefits to make sure they cover substance use disorder treatment.
- Work with your Employee Assistance Program to offer resources for those seeking support groups/treatment.
- Ensure the workplace health plan requires evidence-based treatment protocols for substance use disorder
- Provide transitional return-to-work options for those reintegrating to the workplace after treatment.


